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Data set description

This dataset consists of two parts:

- A drawing of all floor plans and sections created for the dissertation. These drawings show performance venues that were used for symphonic concerts in Tokyo during the period under investigation between 1868 and 1945. The drawings are also shown individually in the dissertation, but the comprehensive overview drawing provided here allows a comparison of the 20 rooms in a format not possible in book form.
- The dataset also contains all of the 3D geometric models used for the simulations in the dissertation, including the source and receiver locations. The simulations performed can thus be reproduced by other interested parties, however the models may also be used for other projects for which they appear suitable.
